

1. Appreciation :-

In spite of most objective and intelligence anticipation the element of surprise cannot be ruled out, yet systematic efforts can be made to combat natural calamities. The contingency planning is essential to achieve successful results. Aurangabad city is not a victim of natural calamities viz. earth quakes, lands slides, famines etc. however, in the event of any natural calamity police have a crucial role in tackling the crime, situation and with this in view police should be mentally and physically alert and ahead of all these organizations in the matter of rendering prompt help for rescue and relief operations. So also providing security and maintaining law and order. To have a contingency planning and with a view to face situation, the scheme for Aurangabad city has been prepared.

2. Name of the Scheme.

This scheme will be known as "NATURAL CALAMITIES (FLOOD) SCHEME for Aurangabad Commissionerate." This scheme is divided into three stages viz. (A) Preparatory state i.e. period before the on set start of natural calamity, (B) Operative state i.e. period during the calamity and (C) Follow up state i.e. period after the calamity has ceased to exist or has subsided.

3. (A) Preparatory stage.

1. Before arrival of monsoon, every year in last week of May, the flood scheme of Commissionerate should be up-dated and mob rehearsal should be conducted and short comings rectified.

2. As monsoon breaks Assistant Commissioner of Police, Incharge of sector should in liaison with Revenue Officer assess the situation on day to day basis. As the number of rivers, reservoir and dams, is not too much in the Commissionerate. Sector incharge should keep watch on quantity of rainfall in catchment areas of the river, dam. They should be in contact with other district control room about rainfall.

Causes of Flood.

1. Heavy rainfall in local area.
2. Heavy rainfall in catchment area in other district.
3. Overflowing of reservoir.
4. Collapsing of dam etc.

The Aurangabad Commissionerate is divided into 2 sectors as shown below:-

Sector No.1 :- Harsul dam- Begampura, MIDC. Cidco P.Stn. area. ACP. Incharge of sector No.1 will be assisted by PSO. P.Stn. MIDC. Cidco, P.I. Begampura.

Sector No.2 :- Cantonment, Waluj, MIDC. Waluj area. ACP. Incharge of sector No.2 will be assisted by PSO. P.Stn. MIDC. Waluj, P.I. Cantonment.

The following village and locality can be affected by floods.

Rivers :-

- 1) Nagzari River - Dhamori village in Waluj P.S. area
- 2) Kham River - Shendurwada, Shivpur village in P.S. Waluj area.
- 3) Sukna River - Chikalthana village in P.S. MIDC. Cidco area.

Dam :-

- 4) Harsul Dam - Jalal Nagar, Al-Hilal Cly, Begampura in P.S. Begampura area.

The Commissionerate has Harsul Dam which is situated on the bank of Kham River. The catchment area is 25.1 Sq. Miles Depth of dam is 27'. The dam overflows at the level of above 27' however before over flowing the excess water can be allowed to let out in Kham river by siphoning as precautionary measure.

If over flowing is not controlled by siphoning it is controlled by sand bags the nearest locality of Dam which can pose danger is Jalalnagar, Al-Hilal Colony, Begampura and it will take 2 hours in the water to reach these areas.

However Municipal Corporation has issued notices to 183 families to vacate the houses which can be affected by flood. The details of the water level and distance of affected area with precautionary measure taken is shown in Appendix-"T".

iv) Sector :-

Harsul Dam sector will be under the charge of A.C.P. City and Waluj sector will be under the charge of A.C.P. Cantt. Both the sectors will be supervised by D.C.P. (Zone) & D.C.P. (Hq.)

Sector wise staff will be provided as per Appendix "D".

The details of the Officers incharge and the area is as under :-

The sector wise arrangements for parking of vehicles, cattle compounds and evacuee camps are shown in appendix "H".

All the sector incharge officers will detail an armed guard of 1 H.C. & 3 P.C's. for the safety and protection of evacuee cattle and the vehicles.

I) Man power planning :-

The requirement of man power for the whole disaster prone area has been assessed as shown in appendix "D" as stated earlier. Assistant Police Commissioner of supervision as an administrative convenience. So also the police inspector have been made incharge of sectors. The officers would report to the concerned police inspector for duties. The inspector/incharge officer will then distribute duties to them as shown in appendix "E".

The control room officer, Aurangabad city will requisite the required number of SRPF. And the Home Guards according to the instruction from the Commissioner of Police, Aurangabad. On receipt of the outside assistance as stated above, control room incharge officer, Aurangabad city control as mentioned in Appendix "D".

The control room officer, Aurangabad city should also ensure that the officers and men detailed for duty as shown in appendix-"D" report directly to the concerned sector officer immediately.

The deployment of various police parties such as patrolling party, rescue operation party, and investigation party evacuation and lost property party, dead, injured, missing and medical aid party and guarding parties should be done by the concerned incharge sector officer. The details of the deployment is shown in appendix- "E".

The sector wise arrangement for reception of man power food and shelter each shown in appendix-"G".

vii) Arrangement for reception of man power :-

On arrival of the man power at the Head Quarter of sector the incharge ACP. Will make necessary arrangement for their shelter, food and transport.

The sector incharge officer should make arrangements for the above men by starting a temporary mess at the above places of shelter. One S.T. Bus will be at the disposal of each sector officer for transporting of requisitioned man power for camping area to the affected area. He should decide the route according to the prevailing climatic conditions.

The details showing the places of shelter for police, SRPF. & Home Guards at the head quarter of each sector is shown in appendix- "F".

iii) Distribution of duties :-

The sector officer should form the following parties and should give necessary instructions to them, regarding the work to be done by them. All the staff should be apprised of their responsibilities and should be warned to have sincerely with unity maintain the prestige of the department.

The details of the different parties detailed sector wise is shown in appendix- "G".

ix) Material planning :-

The material to be used for the flood affected people can be divided into (I) Equipment and (II) consumable commodities. The material should be collected from the district supply officer Aurangabad and voluntary organizations such as Rotary, Lions Clubs etc. The storage should be located at the head quarters of the sector, provision of armed guards of 1 HC. & 3 P.Cs. Has already been made for the safety of the stores, as shown in appendix- "E". The distribution should be decided in consultation with Revenue authorities and village level committee which will be formed for this purpose only, as shown in appendix "M" & "N".

x) Alert plans :-

The mode of raising alarm during watch period is termed as “SAWDHAN” and during executing or actual period as “DHOKA” one jeep fitted with wireless set and loudspeaker will be head quarter for each sector and it should be located at the provided for each sector. The control room officer, Aurangabad in consultation with the M.T. supervisor provide one jeep fitted with wireless and loudspeaker to each sector. The sector officer should ensure that the officer and men of the forces and local inhabitants should be familiarized with the warning system like code words “SAWDHAN” and “DHOKA” during the critical period when the threat becomes imminent. The PSI incharge of patrolling party is shown in appendix-“E” should move in a jeep fitted with loudspeaker in the area of the concerned sector for dissemination of warning.

xi) Evacuation :-

When there is an eminent danger to the life and property and cattle, and the flood level of the river/dam is increasing, the city level relief committee as shown in appendix-“M” & “N” should take in the decision of evacuation in consultation with the concerned sector officers.

As per instruction from the sector officer, the officer incharge of a patrolling party should move in jeep in concerned area/villages and make announcement on loudspeakers for evacuation.

The contingency plan for evacuation has been prepared and buildings in the safe areas have been selected for conversion into evacuee centers as shown in appendix-“H”.

One S.T. Bus has been provided for each sector for the purpose of transportation for evacuation. The route through which S.T. Bus pass, would be decided, according to circumstances by evacuation has been mentioned in appendix-“O”. Apart from this bullock carts can also be used for evacuation.

xii) Means of Communication :-

The normal communications of telegraphs and telephone lines are generally disturbed during floods, earth quakes or any calamity. Hence the alternative means of communication i.e. wireless communication in flood affected area are necessary. For each sector during the location of V.H.F. stations already installed telephone numbers and V.H.F. mobiles to be installed with their call signs is shown in Appendix-“K”

xiii) Police Control Room :-

The sector control rooms have been established in affected areas (sector wise) as shown in appendix “J”. Each control room will be manned by 1 PSI, 2 ASIs, 2 HCs. & 4 PCs. These control room will work as reception centers to receive police personnel deputed from cut centers to receive police personnel deputed from cut side places, for parking the vehicles and missing persons squad. At each control room shown above there will be an information counter for catering to the needs, of the Enquiries and the press. Each sector control room has been equipped with wireless set and telephone facilities. The control room officer, Aurangabad should give vide publicity regarding the telephone numbers and the Inquiry counter at each sector control room mentioned in the inquiry counter at each sector control room mentioned in appendix-“J” of the information of public.

xiv) Police Control Room Aurangabad City :-

On receipt of forecast from meteorological department weather observatory and Irrigation Department regarding the heavy floods, ACP. (C.R.) will take over charge of control room and one PSI. from S.B. and one from C.B. and two from control room will assist the ACP. (Admn), 2 reader PSI, 30 men from control room, 2 five toner and 2 jeeps and 2 platoons of SRPF. In the unit will remain as reserve at control room. ACP. (C.R.) will immediately inform all the officers on the City/Village level relief committee regarding the extent of floods and the villages likely to be affected.

P.I. S.B. will do the patrolling in both the sector with sufficient staff from S.B. and give necessary information to the D.C.P. and C.P.

The control room officer, Aurangabad city then immediately inform the concerned sector and sector officers mentioned above. He will also inform regarding the anticipated calamity i.e. floods to the concerned officers, and ensure that the officers and men report to their place of duties as mentioned in appendix-"D".

As per the orders of the Commissioner of Police, Aurangabad, M.T.O. will make requisition for 3 S.T. Buses from the Divisional controller Aurangabad. He will also ensure that all the jeeps including requisitioned will be fitted with loudspeakers and equipped with wireless sets and ensure the departure to the head quarters of sector mentioned in appendix-"O".

As per instructions from the Commissioner of Police, Aurangabad the control room officer, Aurangabad will send wireless message to the Director General of Police, M.S. Mumbai for requisition of required SRPF. & permission to utilize the services of 200 Home Guards to face the natural calamity. Outside assistance should be dispatched to the places as shown in appendix-"D".

xv) Liaison :-

The concerned sector officers should establish liaison with the local revenue, PWD, Irrigation, Fire Brigade, Home Guards authority, Forest Dept, B.D.O, Medical Officer, Chief Officer of Municipal Committee Co-Ordinate with their plans and take their assistance.

The sector officers and the police control room officer, Aurangabad should also establish liaison.

The relief committees at village level and city level, shown in appendix-"M" & "N" should also establish liaison regarding the work done and to be done regarding flood.

xvi) Location of Hospitals :-

The sector wise names of villages where there are Govt. Hospitals, Primary Health Centers are located has been given in appendix-"I".

The concerned sub-control room officer should inform and alert the medical officers that the needy persons will be sent to the hospitals for medical attendance and they should be in ready ness. The doctors should also be informed to keep adequate stock of necessary standard medicines.

B) Operative Stage :-

1. The control room is located at Aurangabad Commissionerate and control room will start monitoring round the clock, when there is a threat of flood.

2. The control room officer, Aurangabad and sub-control room officers should ensure all the man power detailed for duty including "Reserves" are alert and have taken their positions.

3. The sector officers should send, out patrolling parties in jeeps fitted with loudspeaker and equipped with wireless sets to the flood affected or likely to be affected areas in their respective sectors. This patrolling parties should start dissemination of information regarding the actual occurrence to the floods and make the announcement of code word "DHOKA".

4. Sector officers should send evacuation parties to the worst affected area giving the top preference as shown in appendix-"E". The officer incharge of this party should contact and take the assistance and the help of the village/city level relief committee which is shown in appendix-"M" & "N".

5. The control room officer, Aurangabad should contact the voluntary organizations and relief organizations, appraise them the situation in the flood affected area and ensure that they should go on functioning as per the plans.

6. In the appendix-"E" of the scheme, 1 PSI, 5 policemen, 1 SRPF. Men and 10 Home Guard have been detailed for evacuation and lost property for each sector, so also a party of 1 ASI and 3 police men have been detailed for guarding the lost and unclaimed property the police sub-inspector incharge of lost property will move the affected area and make necessary arrangement to collect lost/abandoned properties at one place. He will detail the guarding party at the selected place for the safety of the above property. He will make arrangements for inventory of all the lost/abandoned property with the help of the staff. The officer then arrange to remove the above property to the police station which is the head quarter of the concerned sector and hand it over police station authorities for safe custody. One copy to the inventory will be kept at sector room for identification purpose and handing it over to the proper claimant.

7. In consultation with the Commissioner of Police, Aurangabad the control room officer, Aurangabad will contact the Civil Surgeon and District Health Officer and arrange to send one Ambulance and Medical Officer and to each sector head quarters. A party of 1 ASI, 5 policemen and 5 home guards have been detailed as Medical Aid party as shown in appendix-"E". The list of Govt. Hospitals individuals requiring medical Aid will be shifted immediately by the Medical Aid party to the head quarter of concerned sector where they will be given first aid treatment and those who are seriously injured and require further medical treatment will be sent to Govt. Hospital as shown in appendix-"I". The control room officer will make a notice to which hospital the patient has been moved, to avoid crowding in the particular hospital.

8. The evacuee camps in the affected areas have been early marked appendix "I". The sector control room officer will contact Aurangabad Municipal Corporation and Municipal Committee as mentioned in appendix-"P" & ensure in co-ordination with control room officer Aurangabad that the fire brigade and water tankers from Zilla Parishad. PWD and Irrigation department are sent to provide drinking water to relief camps. The Tahsildar and concerned revenue officials should also ensure that the voluntary organizations provide food and clothing to the needy person. The stock, fodder for cattle and food to domestic animals.

9. Sector room officer of each sector should prepare separate registers of the dead, missing injured stranger and the evacuated persons with details of their location from the total strength of the sector room as mentioned in appendix-"E". An information cell consisting of 1 ASI & 2 PCs. should be opened to deal with the Enquiries in connection with the above persons. All the sub control room officers should communicate the above information for the purpose of co-ordination and also for publicity.

10. The officers incharge of sector should take a note of good work done by officers men and members of the public during the course of the operation. He should bring it the notice of sector incharge officers Commissioner of Police whenever they pay visit to this area. The superior officers if satisfied about the good work done by the particular individuals they should be suitably rewarded on the spot and it should be publicized immediately.

11. The concerned police station officers should depute 2 police men at the Govt. Hospitals where the injured persons from the flood affected would be kept for treatment with a view to preventing the front to maintain law and order there.

12. The police inspector welfare, Aurangabad city alongwith Medical staff with Ambulance who will report for duty is directed to relief camps for rendering medical treatment to be injured persons.

(C) Follow up state :-

1. The investigation party consisting of 1 police sub inspector, 5 UHCs. and 5 home guards has been detailed for each sector as shown in appendix-"E". The incharge officers of the other parties mentioned in appendix-"E". He should prepare all sorts of panchanamas in connection with the natural condition. He should see that anti-social elements and criminals do not take undue advantage of the situation.

2. The sector officers should visit the relief camps and supervise the work of dispersal of the evacuees and allow them to go systematic way.

3. With a view to preventing the epidemics in the floods affected areas and villages the sector officers should necessary co-ordinate with medical health and sanitation authorities. The city level relief committee should hold meeting at the head quarter of each sector area prepare a plan and take necessary action to not in motion. The medical, health and sanitation authorities to prevent epidemic in the flood affected areas.

4. A party of 2 HCs, 8 PCs & 5 home guards has been formed at each sector as shown in appendix-"E". To attend to salvage operation from damaged houses, buildings. The sector officer may utilize the services of reserve staff if required.

5. DCP. (Zone), & DCP (Hq) and concerned ACP. Should take a decision in consultation with the sector officer regarding with drawl of the man power deployed in the flood affected area. He should not in hurry close the relief centers.

6. The officer incharge of the information cell in sector room of each sector should finalize the list of dead, missing and injured persons with identification of marks in co-ordination with relatives of dead, injured, missing party as shown in appendix-"E". After finalizing the list, the same should be communicated to the control room officer Aurangabad who will give it to the press for the publication.

7. A police sub-inspector incharge of lost property will finalize the list and the details of unclaimed and abandoned property with the description. The officer incharge of information cell will publicize it for claiming them by the proper claimant.

8. The sector officer, should see that all the officers and men deployed for the duties area accounted correctly with their equipment's and no one of them is missing, or absent. After that he should be dispatched to their respective head quarters.

9. The sector officers, A.C's.P./D.C's.P. and the Commissioner of Police, will then thank/appreciate all person ileitis/agencies at their respective levels for their valuable co-operation with the police dett. by sending letters of thanks and also through the press.

10. The control room officer, Aurangabad will prepare a resume of the police operations during the calamity highlighting the good work done by the officers and men and should see that it is published in all the local news papers, after obtaining approval from the Commissioner of Police, Aurangabad city.

11. The sector officers and the sectors before dispersing should think over and note down the shortcomings and strong points during the whole episode with a view to overcome the situation in future.

12. Last but not least, it may be mentioned here that this scheme has been prepared to combat natural calamities particularly floods in Aurangabad city. This scheme may not be self sufficient but it can definitely give the idea and planning regarding the duties to be performed and efforts to be made to save valuable life of persons and property. It may also be pointed out here that the scheme has been thought of in the event of all the rivers getting flooded at a time, which is a remote possibility.

The rivers which will have the floods, the sectors concerned can only be set in motion and do the best to save the life and property and do the best possible to serve mankind.

The flood relief stores will be provided under arrangements Pune sub area.

Organization of flood relief columns :-

One columns consisting of 1 officer, 2 JCOs & 46 OR will be formed. Each column will be self sufficient for transport and administration. Organization for the columns is at appendix-“A”.

Degree of readiness :-

(a) **Warning** :- On receipt of information from civil/own intelligence sources adequate notice will be given to sector commander and other connected with relief operation. A control room will be established at this head quarters to be manned by a duty officer round the clock.

(b) **Preparatory phase (phase-I)** :- On code word “HOSHIAR” normal preparation for relief operation will commence.

(c) **Execution phase (phase-II)** :- One code word “BACHAO” will be into effect and troops will move in aid of civil authorities.

(d) **Re-induction Phase (phase-III)** :- On code word “SHUKRIYA” the troops with equipment will return.

(e) **Stand down phase (phase-IV)** :- On code work “SHANTI” will indicate stand down.

Communication :-

The column will be through to each other and the column commander on RS ANPRC-25 (WB). The column commander in turn will be through on the HB sets to both the control room established at Harsul and Waluj head quarters city is affected. The joint control room at head quarters Aurangabad, sub area and the sector commander at Aurangabad.

Administration :-

Supplies :- Troops will be self contained for four days, plus 3 days reserve rations will be carried. Replenishment will be arranged by the Assistant Administrative Officer of the head quarter Aurangabad.

Dress :- Combat Dress will be worn. However while carrying out tasks dress will be jungle hat/cap FS, vest, shorts, boots and cape water proof.

Arms and ammunition :- Troops employed for guard duties. Escorts and are cordoning will be armed with rifles and carry pouch.

Reports and returns :-

A four hourly report covering the following aspects will be given to head quarter Aurangabad.

- (a) Area flooded.
- (b) Quantum of Troops/Equipment deployed.
- (c) Date, Time.
- (d) Loss of life and property, if any.

The following must be ensured while implementing flood relief scheme :-

- (a) Troops are not used for disposal of dead bodies.
- (b) Safety of all personnel is ensured at all times.
- (c) The discipline and behavior of troops must be of the highest order.

It may be clarified that all the stores required for implementing the flood relief scheme are not available with the Army Hq. Aurangabad and as such would require to be procured through district administration will therefore have to provide some of the available equipment and land stores given with them as given at appendix-“J”.

The existing civil administrative set up for flood relief operations is as given appendix-“C”.

APPENDIX “C”
CIVIL ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP FOR FLOOD RELIEF OPERATION

General

1. The period of monsoon rains in the district is generally August-October, which is therefore also the flood prone period in the year.

Early Warning.

2. Besides, the Meteorological Department of Maharashtra Govt. which gives forecasts of heavy rainfall in the region, the executive engineer (Irrigation) Jaikwadi Project/ Sikhewar Dam, is responsible for issue of early warning for floods. The warning is disseminated down to village level by the civil administration. The Executive Engineer (Irrigation) is also responsible to forecast any abnormal release of water from the reservoir which may result in floods.

Administrative setup for flood relief.

3. The police and home guards under the affected district are available to civil administration for flood relief operations. Various committee and organization setup in the district for flood relief operation are as given below :-
